This included footage from the car behind the wreck, approaching the wreck.

In the past some have suggested a memorial be placed at the site. But frankly, nobody would see it. Perhaps the best memorial would be not to forget the event, the lives lost, and the location whenever we pass that way... especially this Labor Day weekend.

It All Start With An Ambroid S Scale Snow Plow

It was 1966 or 67, I went to a railroadianna auction in a church basement in Fox Point, Wisconsin (North of Milwaukee). There were lots of timetables, lanterns, decks of cards, pencils, railroadianna stuff, lots of HO trains, and one S gauge item – an Ambroid S scale snow plow built from the kit. After several hours the snow plow finally came up for bids (the last item). I was the winning bidder and while standing in line to pay for the snow plow, Chuck Porter came over and introduced himself and happily remarked "I finally meet another S gauger!" We talked about S gauge, trains, and other S gaugers in the area. Chuck also said we should start an S gauge club.

In the next few years we would run into each other at RR related functions and when Chuck would locate or pick up some American Flyer or other toy trains he would call me. One time I went out to his Oconomowoc home (right next to the Milwaukee Road main line) and bought a bunch of Lionel Standard gauge trains! Another time I was in his basement looking at trains and he said "I hear that some American Flyer collectors are crazy enough to pay \$100.00 for one of these orange Shell tank cars?" I asked if he had one, of course he did! After looking at it I said "I guess I am one of those crazy AF collectors who would pay \$100.00!" That car made us both very happy that night! That night and every other time we met we talked about starting an S gauge club.

Chuck was a doer and started the ball rolling on October 8, 1975 by sending a letter out to all area S gaugers that he knew about start an S gauge club. On the evening of November 20, 1975 was the first meeting on Badgerland S Gaugers at Chuck's home. There were 10 S gaugers at this first meeting: Chuck Porter, Don Fliss, Harry Wiesner, Harold Immekus, Roy Meissner, John Wickland, Fred Vergenz, Bob Ristow, David F. Koehler, and David R. Koehler. The name Badgerland S Gaugers was Chuck's idea.

Chuck was an S gauger but also loved full size 4' – 8-1/2" gauge and narrow gauge trains that he chased all his life. Another hobby of Chuck's was Photography and through his life he amassed a collection of over 40,000 35mm railroad slides! Chuck shared these slides with the many groups and clubs he attended. Chuck was an active member of BSG, NASG, NMRA, TNSG (Tuesday Night Slide Group), National RR Historical Society and others. Chuck put on 100's of slide shows and clinics for these clubs and others including many conventions, Fall S Fest, Spring S Spree, and others. Chuck was an officer of many clubs, member of the NASG Advisory Council and Constitutional Committee, and a regular columnist for the S GAUGE HERALD magazine.


Chuck was an S scaler and through the years that I knew him he started three S scale layouts in his basement. However, like a lot of us he was never able to finish one. Are there any S gauge layouts finished? Chuck was really too busy with many other things.

We (train friends) have many enjoyable memories with Chuck and he will live on in our hearts and thoughts. I feel like I had a special bond with Chuck because of our long friendship, but I am sure, everyone who knew Chuck felt that way too.
