Milwaukee (November 12, 2012)...Trainfest 2012 was a great success and again set a new record for attendance with a total of 25,569 visitors, exhibitors and volunteers. This year's show hosted 8,326 kids who had a great time in the new Kid's Activity Zone.

Choo Choo Bob and the Holy Smokestacks Revue was a hit with young train fans. "We didn't know what to expect when we headed to Trainfest," said Bob Medcraft creator of the Choo Choo Bob Show and owner of the Choo Choo Bob Store. "We knew that Trainfest was the premier railroad show in the country, but it surpassed all our expectations. I was surprised by how many families were in attendance. We had a great time...and Trainfest was awesome!"

Why join the National Model Railroad Association (NMRA)? This issue we will continue on our excursion to explore the benefits of membership in the NMRA. We are stopping at NMRA headquarters in Chattanoga TN. for a visit to the A. C. Kalmbach Memorial Library. The archives of the NMRA have been housed in the A. C. Kalmbach Memorial Library since 1986. The library is open to the public, but NMRA members receive priority attention and receive discounts on services and publications. Since very few members live in the Chattanoga area most research questions are answered by a call to the library staff which researches thousands of questions each year. To order publications, duplicate materials, rent a video, or ask other questions, please call (423) 894-8144. Visitors can access the library during regular operating hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. ET, Monday - Friday.

The library houses over 7,000 books and manuals, 50,000 magazines, 100,000 photographic images, 900 videos/DVDs, thousands of prototype drawings, timetables, maps and audio recordings. Video/DVD rentals are \$5.00 each. The library is currently working on an accessible online database of the books in its collection.

On my brief online tour of the A.C. Kalmbach Memorial Library I was amazed at all the resources that are available to an NMRA member. I encourage you to take some time to visit the library by going to <a href="https://www.nmra.org">www.nmra.org</a>. This is another great benefit of NMRA membership.
