The trail is located in the Menominee River Valley and runs along the old Milwaukee Road yard tracks and takes the old right-of-way west to 123rd Street (due to the Zoo reconstruction, the trail is closed at 94th Place). The ride will be held on August 12 at 4pm. Food and refreshments are on your own.

We will start at the Milwaukee County Domes parking lot and continue on the Hank Aaron State Trail with stops where the old Milwaukee Road shops were located, Motor Restaurant and Purple Door ice cream. Since the CP yard is located in that area, I'm sure there will be some railfan opportunities as well!



For those who are concerned about hills, The trail does have a 3% uphill grade that starts just west side of the Miller park freeway and it can be avoided.

We have two great clinics lined up and then the meeting will commence including the results of the election. - Chief Clerk (secretary). This role involves attending the board meetings, taking minutes and maintaining the division history amongst other duties. This is a vital position for the health of our organization. If you have the willingness to fill this position email me (below) or contact any board member and pass along your information. Al Lederman has served our division in this capacity for which we are grateful - thank you, Al, for your time and service to the division.
- Layout Tour Coordinator. We are looking for someone to setup and coordinate layout tours for our division. There are some resources available to guide a person in this process (past layouts, membership book etc.). This person would also be on the lookout for inviting new layouts for a tour. After April 2018 layout tours will no longer be available until this role is filled.
- Someone(s) to arrange clinics. The primary task involved in this
 role is to coordinate individuals to give clinics. As many of you have
 experienced these can range from slideshows covering varying
 aspects of railroad history to tree making, weathering, research,
 building experiences and 3D printing. This is a role that can be
 "crowdsourced" to a degree as anyone can send along a clinic they
 would like to offer.

While requests for help often go out the need for a Chief Clerk cannot be overstated enough and for layout tours to continue after April that role needs to be filled. I'm always available at wisedivision@gmail.org and see you soon.

Trainfest Update

As of the beginning of April, we have 33 Layouts, 10 Displays, 12 Vendors and 17 Manufacturers registered for Trainfest 2018. This sign up is on pace with the last couple of years. I will be sending out reminders in mid-April to those who have not submitted their application yet. A new manufacturer to Trainfest, Fame Toys, out of Okinawa Japan will be launching a new product at Trainfest. It is a fully operational LEGO type train car and track that is also compatible with LEGO and O scale track. It comes in kit form and is directed at children age 5 and up.

We have started a new program this year for Jr. Engineers level 2 and up called "Operate on a home layout". We sent out emails to 53 qualified Jr Engineers and to date we have had 5 responses and 2 Jr. Engineers participated in an operating session held on Mark Willmering's Rock Harbor Railroad. Everyone there had a blast! Invitations have also been extended for a session on the Ashland, Superior and Pacific.

Another change for Trainfest 2018 is that scouts in uniform are no longer offered free admission. The committee did not feel we were being fair to all youth groups so we dropped that program. However, since Trainfest is always in need of volunteers, we are now offering youth groups to sign up and provide one hour per person of volunteer time in exchange for free admission. We will use these volunteers to staff the grade crossings on the MLES layout, man exit doors, help with the LEGO layout and possibly the Make & Take programs.


The show goes beyond financial advice with topical advice such as "Should you unfriend Facebook?". Lots of fun and great advice.
